





Disclaimer

The data in this report was collected from 12 counties served by the Office of the Medical Examiner located within the Department of Pathology at Western Michigan University Homer Stryker M.D. School of Medicine (WMed). Data includes deaths in which drugs were listed as the immediate cause of death or as contributory to death on the death certificate. Acute alcohol-related deaths are deemed drug-related deaths and are thus included in this report. This report provides updated statistics in an effort to reduce the frequency of drug-related deaths in the counties we serve. All data presented in this report is preliminary.



Sources: All information was extracted from the Medical Examiner's database of all deaths reported, law enforcement and EMS reports, death certificates, obituaries, STORM (Swift Toxicology of Overdose-Related Mortalities) results, postmortem toxicology reports, and autopsy reports. STORM is an ongoing project used to record suspected drug- and opioid-related deaths in 35 counties in Michigan.

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


Accidental Drug-Related Deaths by Month, All Counties (12)

Opioids Identified in Cause of Death for Accidental Drug-Related Deaths by County




- 146 accidental drug-related deaths involved an opioid*


Polysubstance Use & Drug Type*

- 44 accidental drug-related deaths involved 3 or more substances*
- 78 accidental drug-related deaths involved 2 substances
- 72 accidental drug-related deaths involved only a single substance
- Polysubstance use involving 3 or more substances accounts for 22.7% of all accidental drug-related deaths

Drugs Identified in Cause of Death for Accidental Drug-Related Deaths**





- 7 accidental drug-related deaths involved ingestion of illicit substances



Naloxone (Narcan) Administration in Accidental Drug-Related Deaths




- Naloxone was administered on scene in 31.4% of accidental drugrelated deaths








Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & Education Status

Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & History of Previous Overdose




- 136 accidental drug-related deaths did not have a known or reported history of a previous overdose

- 9.27% of accidental drug-related deaths had a reported previous overdose


