

Acknowledgement

The data in this report was collected from 13 counties served by the Office of the Medical Examiner located within the Department of Pathology at Western Michigan University Homer Stryker M.D. School of Medicine (WMed). Data includes deaths in which drugs were listed as the immediate cause of death or as contributory to death on the death certificate. Acute alcohol-related deaths are deemed drug-related deaths and are included in this report. Leelanau and Osceola County are not included in this report as no drug-related deaths occured in this time period. Contrary to previous reports, mitragynine is no longer considered an opioid and is reported as a non-opioid in this report. This report provides updated statistics in an effort to reduce the frequency of drug-related deaths in the counties we serve. All data in this report is preliminary.



Sources: All information included in this report was extracted from death scene investigation reports, law enforcement and EMS reports, death certificates, obituaries, and autopsy reports.



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

Drug-Related Deaths by Month, All Counties (11)








Opioid-Related Deaths

- 72 (52%) of all accidental drug-related deaths involved fentanyl
- 85 (61.5%) of all accidental drug-related deaths involved fentanyl or some type of opioid
- **13 (9.4%)** Non-fentanyl opioid(s)






Polysubstance Use & Drug Type


Number of Substances Listed on Death Certificate that Contributed to

^{*}Only showing instances where each drug combination occurred more than once in this time period




Route of Administration for Accidental Drug-Related Deaths



- 17 (13)% of accidental drug-related deaths involved smoking of illicit substances
- Accidental drug-related deaths also involved:
 - 12 (8.7%) Insufflation*
 - 12 (8.7%) Ingestion
 - 12 (8.7%) Intravenous(IV)

*Insufflation is the act of blowing a substance into a body cavity. This route of administration is commonly known as "snorting".

Location of Injury & Accidental Drug-Related Deaths






(Narcan) Administration








- 129 were not veterans






Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & Housing Status

- 18 were unhoused


Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & Employment Status

Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & Marital Status




Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & Education Status








Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & History of Previous Overdose

Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & History of Incarceration


• 21 (15%) of all accidental drug-related deaths had a history of jail or incarceration at some point in their life







Accidental Drug-Related Deaths & History of Mental and Chronic Illness



- 51 (33%) of all accidental drug-related deaths had a documented or family history of mental illness or suicidal ideation
- 87 (55%) of all accidental drug-related deaths had a documented history of chronic illness
- **34 (22%)** of all accidental drug-related deaths had **both** a documented history of mental illness and a chronic illness








